Year 5 Geography

Location Knowledge

Locate the UK's main countries, counties, cities, physical and human features. Locating world countries on a map, identifying key geographical characteristics.

Pupils can navigate an atlas and find information effectively.

Pupils can locate key lines of latitude, longitude, and understand time zones.

Locate major mountain ranges of the world. Locate the main mountain ranges of the UK.

Pupils can identify and locate North and South America, including the environmental regions, physical and human features, countries and major cities.

Place knowledge

Pupils can understand the physical and human characteristics of the West Midlands and Birmingham- our nearest large city/urban area.

Human and physical geography

Describe the key features of a mountain.

Understand how fold mountains are formed.

Identify and understand the dangers of the mountain environment.

Describe and label the interior of a volcano.

Pupils know the 3 types of geography and can list examples.
